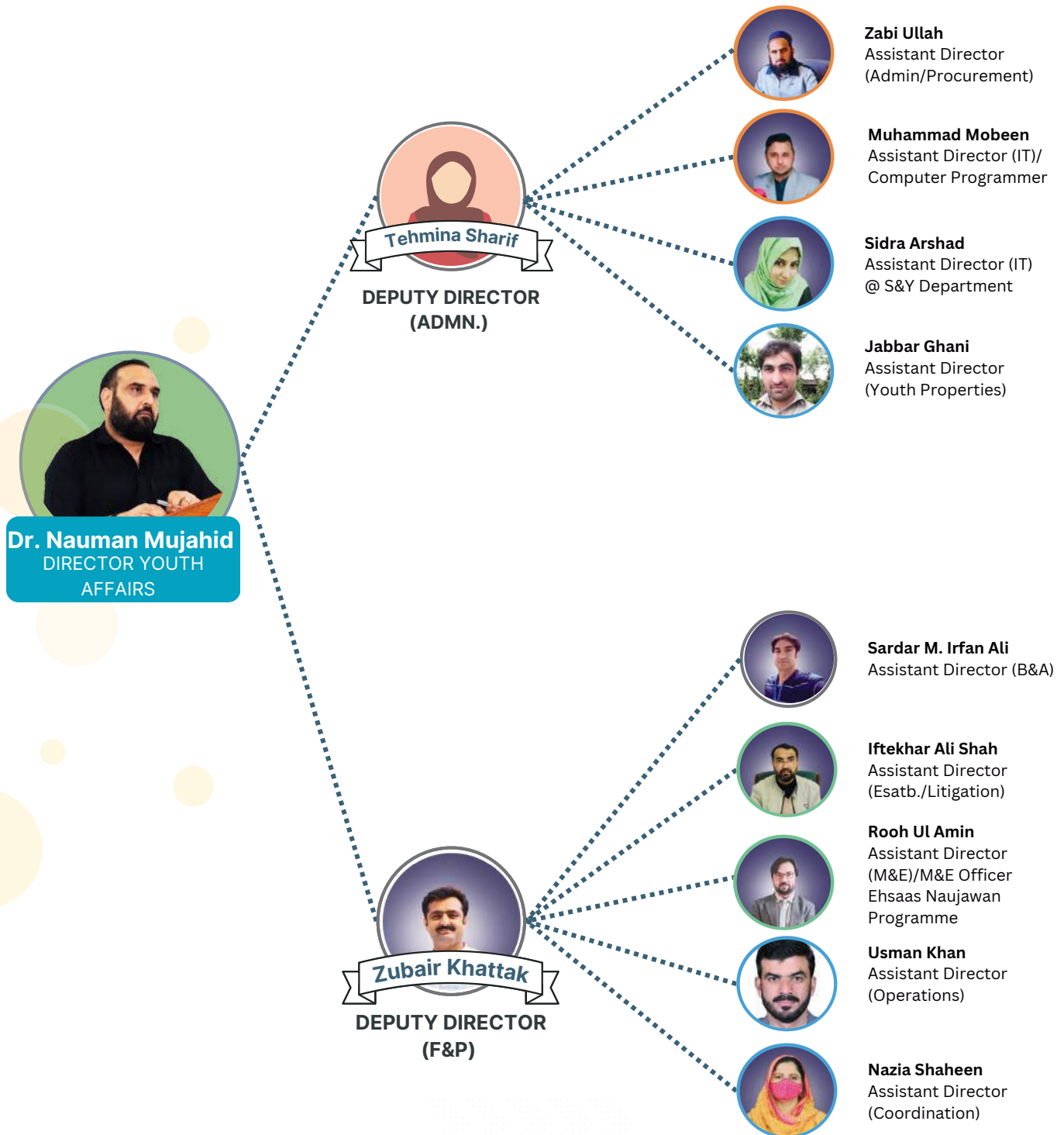

## ESTABLISHMENT OF JAWAN MARAKIZ

Additionally, the Directorate is actively involved in the establishment of Youth Facilities in settled and Merged Districts (MDs) and in recognition of the unique challenges and opportunities faced by youth in the districts. 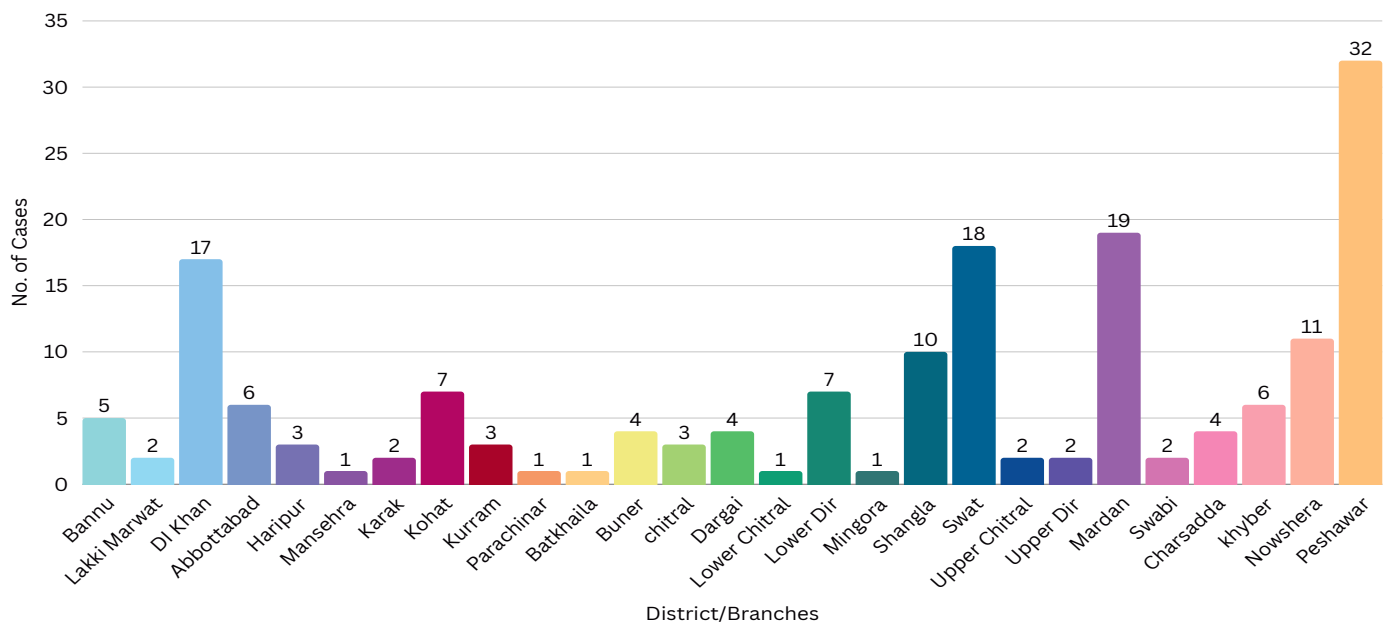

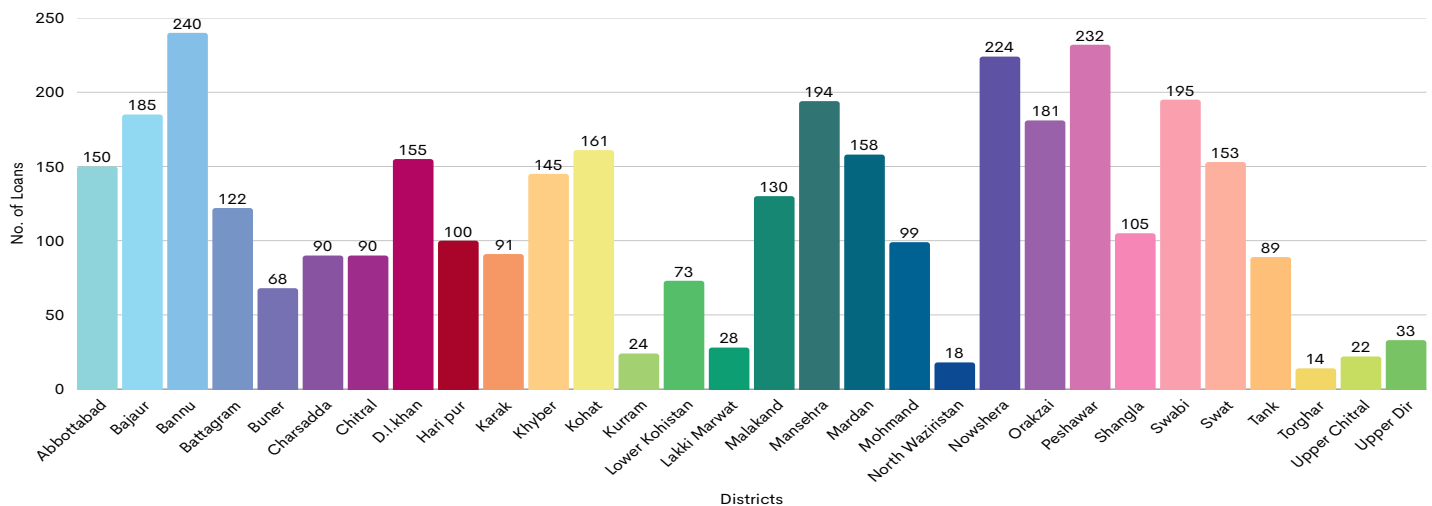

# BRIEF REPORT: EHSAA NAUJAWAN LOAN DISBURSEMENT CEREMONY



Date: 20th June 2025

Location: Shergarh

On 20th June 2025, a disbursement ceremony under the Ehsaas Naujawan Programme, KP was held at a local Masjid in Shergarh. A total of 7.35 million PKR was distributed among 27 youth beneficiaries to support their entrepreneurial ventures.

The event was attended by Mr. Chaudhry Arshad (Manager Projects, Akhuwat) and his team, and Mr. Zia Ul Islam from the Finance Department KP. Mr. Abdul Qayyum, Team Lead, Debt/Risk Management Unit, Finance Department KP, joined via WhatsApp video call and personally spoke with the youth, offering guidance on loan utilization, business planning, and repayment responsibilities.

As Coordinator Ehsaas Naujawan Programme and Assistant Director M&E, I addressed the participants on entrepreneurship, innovation, use of social media for business growth, loan return mechanisms, and the broader vision of the Chief Minister KP, Minister for Youth Affairs, and Directorate of Youth Affairs KP.

Mr. Arshad also briefed attendees on Akhuwat's mission of poverty alleviation through interest-free lending. The event concluded with a cheque distribution ceremony and Dua.

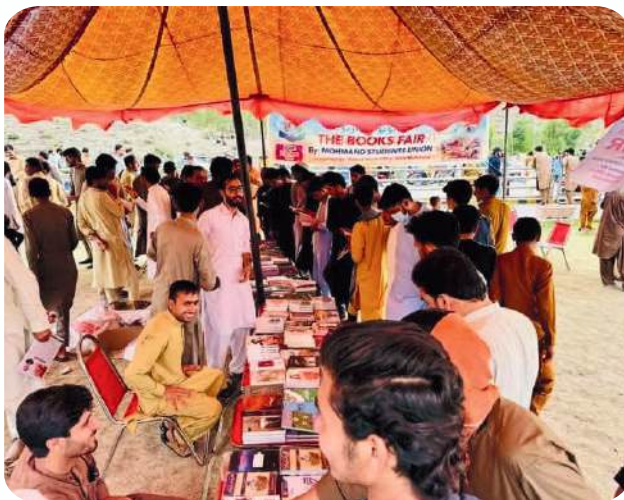
### STAGE DRAMA ON YOUTH STRUGGLES AND DRUG AWARENESS

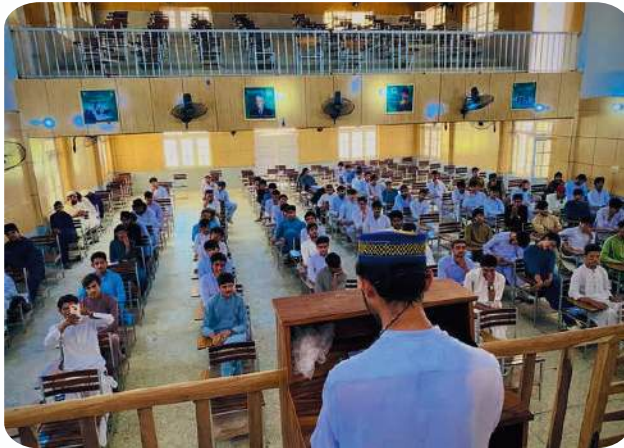




## DISTRICT YOUTH OFFICE MALAKAND

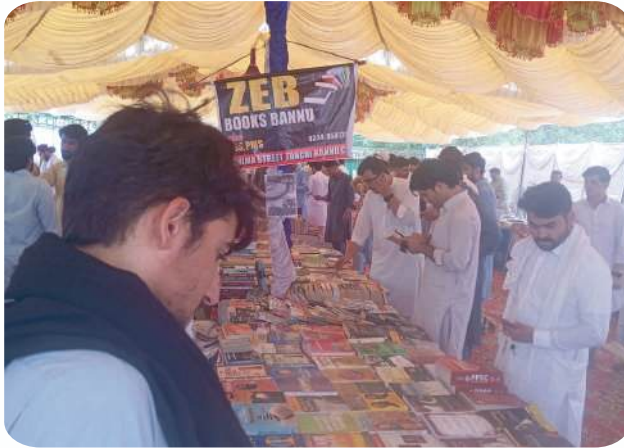




## DISTRICT YOUTH OFFICE BANNU

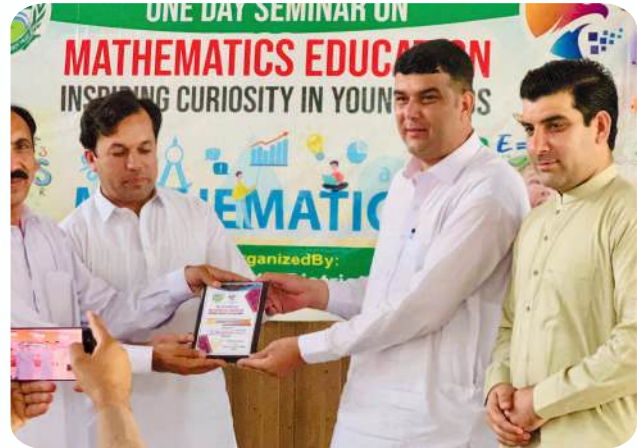




## DISTRICT YOUTH OFFICE SWAT

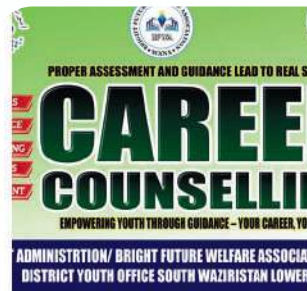
### EDUCATIONAL AWARENESS SEMINAR ON "TALEEM O TARBIYAT"
