




## YOUM-E-ISTEHSAAL OBSERVED WITH SOLIDARITY FOR KASHMIR



On 5th August 2025, Youm-e-Istehsaal was observed with deep solemnity to mark six years since India's unilateral abrogation of Article 370, which revoked the special status of Jammu & Kashmir. The program commenced with one minute of silence in solidarity with Kashmiri martyrs, followed by an impactful lecture by the Director Youth Affairs highlighting the historical background, human rights violations, and the Kashmiris' ongoing struggle against illegal occupation. Later, a solidarity rally was held where participants raised powerful slogans supporting Kashmir's freedom and condemning Indian atrocities. The event reaffirmed unity with Kashmiris and urged global action for justice and self-determination.



### Statement Report on Youth Development Schemes Progress

- The following is a consolidated statement on the financial and physical progress of various youth development schemes:
- Upgradation of Battakundi Youth Hostel (Phase-I) has been completed with 100% financial and physical progress. The total cost of 33.00 has been fully utilized.
- Construction of Peshawar Youth Complex has achieved 64% financial progress (307.231 expended out of 474.499) and 72% physical completion. Work is ongoing with satisfactory progress.
- Construction of Jawan Markaz Mohmand is nearly complete, with 100% financial utilization (111.00 expended) and 98% physical progress. Minor work remains unfinished.
- Construction of Jawan Markaz Swabi shows 32% financial progress (34.76 expended out of 107.350) and 50% physical completion. Physical work is ahead of financial expenditure, indicating potential delays in fund disbursement.
- Construction of Jawan Markaz Mardan has utilized 32% of funds (46.02 out of 146.060) but has achieved 80% physical progress, reflecting efficient execution despite lower spending.
- Construction of Jawan Markaz D.I.Khan has reached 37% financial progress (40.67 expended out of 111.380) and 60% physical completion. Progress is steady but requires closer monitoring.
- Construction of Jawan Markaz Haripur lags behind, with only 29% financial progress (42.47 out of 148.430) and 40% physical completion. Accelerated efforts are needed to meet targets.
- Construction of Jawan Markaz South Waziristan Lower is the slowest, with 22% financial progress (37.62 out of 171.062) and 35% physical completion. Immediate intervention is required to expedite work.

#### **District Mohmand: Jawan Markaz**

The construction of Jawan Markaz Mohmand has achieved 98% physical completion with full utilization of the allocated Rs. 111.00 million budget. The project is currently in its final phase of completion, with only minor finishing works remaining before operationalization.



### **District Swabi: Steady Progress**

In Swabi, approximately 40% of the Jawan Markaz construction has been completed. Column erection is in progress, and building materials are adequately stocked on-site.



### Grand Youth Complex Peshawar: 70% Complete

Construction on the Grand Youth Complex in Peshawar is 70% complete. This facility will be a central hub for youth activities in the region.


### Upper Chitral, Upper Dir, Shangala, Buner, Karak, Bannu, Kohat, Malakand


