ESTABLISHMENT OF JAWAN MARAKIZ

SECRETARY SPORTS & YOUTH AFFAIRS VISITS UNDER-CONSTRUCTION GRAND YOUTH COMPLEX



The Secretary Sports, Mr. Hassan Sadaat, visited the under-construction Grand Youth Complex in Peshawar, accompanied by Additional Secretary Sports Pir Abdullah Shah, Director Youth Dr. Nauman Mujahid, and Director Works Mr. Ahmed Ali. During the visit, the Director Youth Affairs briefed him on various segments of the complex, including separate skills development and incubation centers for male and female youth, co-working spaces for startups, a state-of-the-art IT lab, a 500-seat auditorium, multipurpose rooms for conferences and workshops, career counselling rooms, a cafeteria, and offices for the Directorate staff. The Secretary appreciated the quality of the ongoing work but stressed the need to increase the pace, setting a deadline for the contractor to complete the project by December 2025.

YOUNG LEADERS SUMMER CAMP 2025











The Directorate of Youth Affairs Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, in collaboration with the Culture & Tourism Authority, supported the Young Leaders Parliament in organizing a four-day Young Leaders Summer Camp 2025 in Islamabad and Nathiagali. Seventy participants, including youth from merged districts, engaged in sessions on leadership, climate action, digital skills, eco-tourism, and entrepreneurship, while also gaining parliamentary exposure through visits to the National Assembly and Senate. The camp provided a platform for learning, networking, and knowledge-sharing, with renowned speakers inspiring participants through their expertise. This initiative proved to be a memorable experience, fostering youth empowerment, civic awareness, and national-level connectivity among participants.

INSPECTION VISIT TO SWABI JAWAN MARKAZ CONSTRUCTION SITE



On 15th September 2025, the Director Youth Affairs conducted an inspection visit to the Swabi Jawan Markaz, where construction activities were observed in progress. Labour was present on-site; however, the quality of construction material, particularly cement and brickwork, was found unsatisfactory. The concerned SDO, Mr. Hazrat Ali, was directed to visit the site and submit a detailed technical report. It was noted that the first-floor roof RCC (lanter) work had been completed, while the structural work on the second floor was also finished. The overall physical progress of the project was assessed at approximately 40%.

INSPECTION VISIT TO HARIPUR JAWAN MARKAZ CONSTRUCTION SITE













Director Youth Affairs conducted an inspection visit to the Haripur Jawan Markaz, where construction activities were found in progress with labour actively engaged on-site. The available construction material was checked and found satisfactory. On the first floor, wall plastering work was ongoing, while the roof RCC (lanter) had already been completed. On the second floor, RCC supports had been provided, though concreting was still pending, for which the contractor was instructed to complete the lanter work within one week. The overall physical progress of the project was assessed at approximately 45%.

3-DAY YOUTH CONFERENCE









The Asghar Mohmand Foundation, with support from the Directorate of Youth Affairs Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, organized a three-day residential youth conference titled "Empowering Youth for a Brighter Mohmand" at Khanaspur Youth Hostel, Ayubia, from 12th to 14th September 2025. The event engaged 35 youth from District Mohmand in leadership development, skills enhancement, idea-sharing, and cultural activities. Key speakers included Mr. Imtiaz Ali, PhD Scholar at Bacha Khan University and former Youth CM, who led sessions on peacebuilding, digital literacy, conflict resolution, and career counselling, and Mr. Shireen Khan, Principal at Government High School Mohmand, who emphasized education, cultural preservation, and community leadership.

AGHAR MOHMAND FOUNDATION, YOUTH AFFAIRS KPK AGREE ON COOPERATION



The Executive Committee of Aghar Mohmand Foundation (AMF), led by Chairman Malik Aghar Khan Mohmand, held a significant meeting with Director Youth Affairs Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Mr. Numan Mujahid. AMF briefed on its social welfare services, including flood relief and youth initiatives, which were highly appreciated. Both parties agreed to initiate joint projects for youth development and committed to signing an MoU soon. The Director Youth Affairs acknowledged AMF's contributions as vital for empowering youth and fostering social progress. This collaboration is expected to enhance youth capabilities, create employment opportunities, and strengthen government-civil society cooperation.

Jawan Marakiz Status

Statement Report on Youth Development Schemes Progress

- The following is a consolidated statement on the financial and physical progress of various youth development schemes:
- Upgradation of Battakundi Youth Hostel (Phase-I) has been completed with 100% financial and physical progress. The total cost of 33.00 has been fully utilized.
- Construction of Peshawar Youth Complex has achieved 64% financial progress (307.231 expended out of 474.499) and 72% physical completion. Work is ongoing with satisfactory progress.
- Construction of Jawan Markaz Mohmand is nearly complete, with 100% financial utilization (111.00 expended) and 98% physical progress. Minor work remains unfinished.
- Construction of Jawan Markaz Swabi shows 32% financial progress (34.76 expended out of 107.350) and 50% physical completion. Physical work is ahead of financial expenditure, indicating potential delays in fund disbursement.
- Construction of Jawan Markaz Mardan has utilized 32% of funds (46.02 out of 146.060) but has achieved 80% physical progress, reflecting efficient execution despite lower spending.
- Construction of Jawan Markaz D.I.Khan has reached 37% financial progress (40.67 expended out of 111.380) and 60% physical completion. Progress is steady but requires closer monitoring.
- Construction of Jawan Markaz Haripur lags behind, with only 29% financial progress (42.47 out of 148.430) and 40% physical completion. Accelerated efforts are needed to meet targets.
- Construction of Jawan Markaz South Waziristan Lower is the slowest, with 22% financial progress (37.62 out of 171.062) and 35% physical completion. Immediate intervention is required to expedite work.





District Mohmand: Jawan Markaz

The construction of Jawan Markaz Mohmand has achieved 98% physical completion with full utilization of the allocated Rs. 111.00 million budget. The project is currently in its final phase of completion, with only minor finishing works remaining before operationalization.



District Swabi: Steady Progress

In Swabi, approximately 40% of the Jawan Markaz construction has been completed. Column erection is in progress, and building materials are adequately stocked on-site.



Grand Youth Complex Peshawar: 70% Complete

Construction on the Grand Youth Complex in Peshawar is 70% complete. This facility will be a central hub for youth activities in the region.





District D.I.Khan: 50% Completed

The construction work of Jawan Markaz D.I. Khan is progressing smoothly, with around 50% of the structure completed. The brick walls and support pillars are already in place, and construction materials are available on-site. The project team is actively working to ensure its timely completion.



District Mardan: Steady Progress

In Mardan, significant progress has been made on the Jawan Markaz construction. Foundation and earth filling have been completed, and beam work on the ground floor is underway. The quality of work has been found satisfactory, showcasing efficient progress within a short timeframe.





Jawan Markaz Development Underway in District Haripur

In District Haripur, work on the Jawan Markaz began at the start of this year with a focus on creating a dynamic space for youth engagement, skill development, and empowerment. Planning and development efforts are underway to ensure the center meets the diverse needs of the youth in the region.



South Waziristan Lower: Work Begins

In South Waziristan Lower, work on the establishment of Jawan Markaz has officially commenced. The center will serve as a hub for youth empowerment, learning, and community engagement.

Orakzai, Khurram and North Waziristan: Land Acquired

Land for Jawan Marakiz in these districts has been acquired. These centers are expected to deliver much-needed infrastructure to empower the youth in these regions.






